

jPiXDb 4.1 INSTALLATION

INSTALLATION PREREQUISITE

The Java Runtime Environment (JRE) version 1.4 or higher must already be installed on your computer before installing jPiXDb. The 1.4 JRE comes already installed with Microsoft Windows XP and Apple OS X. In you use Linux or eComStation, you will have to install Java 1.4 (or higher) if you have not done so already. If you do not have the required JRE, jPiXDb either will not execute or will display a "cannot install" message.

INSTALLATION PROCEDURE

jPiXDb is distributed as a ZIP file, *jpixdb.zip*. To install:

1. Copy *jpixdb.zip* to the folder into which you want jPiXDb installed. jPiXDb will be installed in subfolder *jpixdb* of this folder. jPiXDb will not ask you for the installation folder; you must put *jpixdb.zip* into the folder into which you want jPiXDb installed. On Apple OS X, you must be *jpixdb.zip* into your user home folder, e.g., */Users/yourname*.
2. Unzip *jpixdb.zip* (extract its files) by double-clicking its file icon. The jPiXDb files will be extracted into subfolder *jpixdb*.
3. Go to folder *jpixdb* and execute *jpixdb.jar* by double-clicking the file icon.
4. When jPiXDb starts, the Installation Panel will be displayed. Click the Install button it to start installation. The License Agreement will be displayed. To continue installation, click the Accept button, indicating your acceptance of the License Agreement.
5. jPiXDb will display a confirmation dialog showing the installation folder path. Click the Accept button to do the installation. When it completes, click the Ok button, end jPiXDb (by closing its window), and restart it. When it restarts it will add the sample albums, displaying messages as it does.
6. If you have purchased a registration key, click the registration key button and enter your key.

jPiXDb does not install a program icon (shortcut) on your desktop. If you want one you must create it manually. jPiXDb installs two icon images you can use for the shortcut: *jpixdb.ico* for Microsoft Windows and *jpixdb.gif* for other operating systems.

UNINSTALL

To uninstall jPiXDb, delete the *jpixdb* folder.
